

## **New Look to EF Class Web Sites**

Prof. Schleter kept himself busy over the holiday break by updating the Engineering Fundamentals class web sites. The primary purpose was to make the web sites easier to use on phones. As shown on the graph, 90% of our students own a smartphone. The page header for class pages was reduced to one line so you did not have to scroll down to get to the information





you want, the left menu can

be toggled on and off with one tap allowing the menu to be hid when not needed, and the font size was increased on links to make it easier to select. The anecdotal feedback has been positive, as many students use their phones for the online homework and other class functions.
